HISTORY



History of Lafayette

The second Yankee settler in Contra Costa County was Elam Brown. Elam served as wagon train master for fourteen families who left St. Joseph, Missouri on May 1, 1846. Elam's party crossed the Sierra Nevada Mountains mere days before the ill-fated Donner party became mired in Donner Pass. Elam's party entered Sutter's Fort on August 10, 1846.

In 1847, Brown purchased a 3,329 acre Mexican Land Grant named Rancho Acalanes and 300 cattle for \$900. At that time the going price for cattle was \$2.50 per head on the hoof. In February 1848 he built his first home on the Rancho along with two other families, thereby creating the first community in central Contra Costa County. He helped write the State of California's Constitution, served two terms in the assembly and installed a horse drawn grist mill in Happy Valley. Demand soon outgrew the mill's capacity so in 1853 he built a steam mill on Lafayette Creek behind the present day Park Theater.

During the 1850s, redwood lumber harvested in the Canyon/Moraga area was hauled to Martinez for shipment to San Francisco. The present Lafayette area became the ideal spot for the men to rest, eat, drink and get necessary repairs to their wagons and stock. In 1854 and 1855, Mile Hough was postmaster for the Acalanus Post Office located in his hotel. Why Acalanus wasn't accepted for the town name is unknown. In 1857, Benjamin Shreve, who was applying for the position of postmaster, tried to change the name Acalanus to Centerville. The request was rejected because California already had a Centerville post office. Shreve then reapplied using the name LaFayette, which the community accepted for the town name.

Lafayette remained a quiet farming village until the post-World War 11 building boom turned cornfields into housing developments. The City marked the 150th anniversary of the arrival of the Yankee settlers in 1998. Throughout the yearlong Sesquicentennial celebration, several new monuments to our history were dedicated. These sites included the spot on Happy Valley Road where founder Elam Brown and his family built their first home; the site of the Pony Express Station, which served from 1860-1861, located near the present intersection of Mt. Diablo and Moraga Road; and the homestead of Jenny Bickerstaff, the community's first teacher, in the Diablo Foods parking lot today.

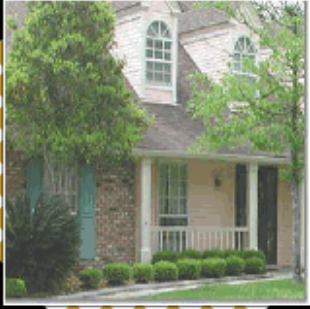

As health care needs expand, so does Walnut Creek's capacity to serve. John Muir/Mt. Diablo Health System and Kaiser Permanente furnish up-to-the-minute treatments and advice. Kaiser Permanente Medical Center contributes to the ever-expanding medical services available for Walnut Creek. Kaiser's surgical staff oversees 6,000 surgeries annually and doctor visits number more than 500,000 each year.

The 321-bed John Muir Medical Center recently merged with Concord's 259-bed Mount Diablo Medical Center to form the John Muir/Mt. Diablo Health System. The merger produced a health system that offers patients advanced technology and state-of-the-art-facilities. John Muir Medical Center is designated as the trauma center for Contra Costa County, and has a specialized team of highly trained professionals ready for any emergency. The Medical Pavilion, a 73-bed facility located in neighboring Concord, provides behavioral health care for children, adolescents and adults.

Briones

With its rolling, grassy hills and secluded, shady canyons, Briones is a secret wilderness surrounded by the towns of central Contra Costa County. Although the park is close to Lafayette, Walnut Creek, Pleasant Hill, Concord, and Martinez, there are peaks within it from which you can see only park and watershed lands for miles in every direction. Briones is an ideal park for hikers, runners, and horseback riders. There are five major access points, of which the two most developed are the Alhambra Creek Valley Staging Area off Reliez Valley Road near Martinez, and the Bear Creek Road Staging Area near Orinda and Lafayette.

Community Center

Location: 500 St. Mary's Road

The City purchased the Community Center in 1983 from the Lafayette Elementary School District. It was formerly Burton Elementary School. The Community Center has 10 rooms which are various sized and used for a number of recreational purposes. Examples include classes for all ages, special events, lectures and meetings. Some of the rooms may be rented by the general public on the weekends.

Community Park

Location: 480 St. Mary's Road -- 1 mile east of the Community Center

The 68-acre site of Lafayette Community Park contains a diverse array of topography, wildlife and recreation opportunities. The south-end has two sports fields that are used for baseball in the Spring and soccer in the Fall. There is a group picnic area that can be reserved and several single picnic tables. A Tot Playground with an adjoining lawn is near the picnic area and fields. A footbridge leads people from the parking lot, located at 480 Saint Mary's Road, to the fields, picnic area and public restrooms. A natural trail meanders through the entire park. Improvements on the north-end of the park will start during the next five years.

Brook Street Park

Location: 1/3rd of an acre located one block west of Moraga Road on Brook Street.

The park was recently renovated and brought up to current accessibility standards. There are shaded picnic tables, a drinking fountain and benches. The newly installed Pirate Ship play equipment captures the imaginations of pre-school aged children with its top deck, steering wheel, climbing ropes and port-holes. The play equipment area has a low perimeter fence that keeps the children safely enclosed. The low-seated picnic table at the back of the park has a shade structure and side serving table making it a perfect place for pre-school aged birthday parties. Brook Street Park was designed as a neighborhood park and there is a limited amount of street parking.

Directions: Take Highway 24 eastbound to the Acalanes Rd. exit. Continue down the off ramp, through the light on Mt. Diablo Blvd. Continue on Mt. Diablo Blvd. for approximately 1 mile. The Recreation Area entrance will be on your right.

Parks and Recreation Continued:

Leigh Creekside Park

Location: 1.1 acres located on the corner of Moraga Blvd. and 4th Street.

Bordered by Las Trampas Creek and the Lafayette Moraga Regional Trail, Leigh Creekside Park is situated in the heart of a densely populated downtown neighborhood. However, standing magnificently at the entrance, the crowning jewel is the majestic, centennial oak. The park provides a shady resting place for people who use the regional trail and an open area for neighborhood kids to play. Picnic tables, benches, a drinking fountain and informal paths make it a great place to enjoy the natural surroundings.

Lafayette Reservoir

Lafayette Reservoir is located off of Highway 24 and a mile from the Lafayette BART station. This all-year, day-use area is ideal for hiking, jogging, fishing, boating and picnicking. Rowboats and pedal boats can be rented. Private rowboats, canoes, kayaks and small sailboats are allowed if carried atop your auto (no gasoline engines). Launching docks and a small bait shop are added conveniences. A daily fishing access fee (\$3.00) is required. (Fees here and at other EBMUD reservoirs cover costs of stocking fish taken by anglers.) Families, groups and companies can reserve picnic areas holding 50 or 200 people. Many individual tables and barbecues accommodate smaller groups. Two play areas offer lively fun for children. The park has restrooms and a disabled-access fishing dock with adjacent parking. The daily entry fee to the park is \$6.00, and hours of operation range from 6:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m., depending on the season. Discounts for seniors and disabled persons are available also.

Directions: Take Highway 24 eastbound to the Acalanes Rd. exit. Continue down the off ramp, through the light on Mt. Diablo Blvd. Continue on Mt. Diablo Blvd. for approximately 1 mile. The Recreation Area entrance will be on your right..

Mount Diablo State Park

This park is one of the ecological treasures of the San Francisco Bay Area. Every season in the park has its special qualities. Discover for yourself the mountain's beautiful wildflowers, its extensive trail system, fascinating wildlife and distinctive rock formations. View the stars from its lofty heights, bike ride to its 3,849 foot summit or explore the more remote trails by horseback. The park offers hiking, biking, horseback riding and camping.

Directions: The park may be accessed by vehicle from either the Danville area (Mount Diablo Scenic Boulevard) or the Walnut Creek area (North Gate Road). Highway 680 to Danville; take Diablo Road exit, then 3 miles east to Mount Diablo Scenic Blvd.

Seasons/Climate/Recommended Clothing: Summers are generally hot and dry. The rainy season is generally from November through mid-March. Visitors in the winter occasionally experience a snowfall on the mountain peak.

Facilities - Activities: Many visitors to Mount Diablo head straight for the summit to enjoy the famous view. Summer days are sometimes hazy, and the best viewing is often on the day after a winter storm. Then, you can look to the west, beyond the Golden Gate Bridge, to the Farallon Islands; southeast to the James Lick Observatory on Mount Hamilton at 4,213 feet elevation; south to Mount Loma Prieta in the Santa Cruz Mountains at 3,791 feet elevation, north to Mount Saint Helena in the Coast Range at 4,344 feet elevation, and still farther north to Mount Lassen in the Cascades at 10,466 feet. North and east of Mount Diablo the San Joaquin and Sacramento Rivers meet to form the twisting waterways of the Delta. To the east beyond California's great central valley, the crest of the Sierra Nevada seems to float in space.

Observation Deck Telescopes are mounted on the deck to help visitors enjoy one of the finest views in the world. On the walk up the circular stairway to the observation deck, visitors are treated to a look at ancient marine fossils embedded in the sandstone walls of the summit building. In the rotunda they are reminded of Mt. Diablo's importance as a survey point. Above the rotunda is a beacon, historically important to aviators and now lighted once a year on December 7 in memory of those who lost their lives at Pearl Harbor.

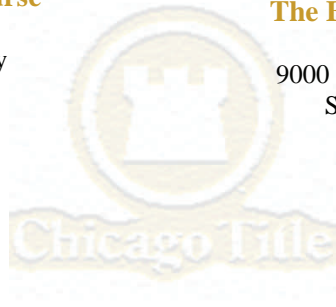
